"The paper argues that current design modelling approaches do not capture conveniently the dynamics of complex early design processes (in particular uncertainty, concurrency, collaborative iteration, and adaptive decision-making) and proposes a multi-agent system modelling approach instead. Its applicability is demonstrated through an investigation into varying levels of externally-driven requirements changes."



"We used quantitative proteomics and nano-structural imaging and profiled ~1800 proteins from human red blood cells. Further, proteome-wide changes that account for transition in shape and deformability during cell maturation were discovered. Our results can now explain molecular basis of red blood cell diseases where maturation is impaired."
